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## College Profile

Peren Government College started with a humble beginning when it was established as a private college on 13<sup>th</sup> April, 1987 through the joint efforts of the local public leaders and government officers of the then Peren Sub-Division with the objective to bring the socially, economically and educationally less advantaged people of the sub-division to frontline society. Since then, Peren Government College has been catering to this need of the people, even under most trying situations.

Initially, from 1987 to early part of 1991 the College was running Pre-University (Arts) classes only during afternoon hours from Government High School building, Peren with barely a handful of students enrolled. With an increase in the enrolment of students the College was shifted during mid 1991 to Old Boys Hostel, GHS, Peren Town. Class timing was changed from afternoon to morning shift in the year 1992. The College was upgraded to a Degree Course during 1992-93 session. The college is shifted to its permanent campus at Peren District Headquarters in June 2024 which is roughly 7 km away from Peren Town and 20 km from Jalukie Town.

The College was then recognised by the Government of Nagaland on 9<sup>th</sup> December, 1993 and is provisionally affiliated to Nagaland University since 1995. The College is recognized by UGC under section 2 (f) of the UGC Act 1956 and was taken over by the Government of Nagaland in 2006.

The College's Advisory Board comprises of the Deputy Commissioner, Peren as the Chairman, Principal, Peren Government College as the Member-Secretary, Prof. Manoj Dutta, as the Representative of Nagaland University along with HoDs of various government departments and stakeholders of the district as members. ### UNDER GRADUATE PROGRAM AND OTHER PROGRAM

Peren Government College, an undergraduate college, affiliated to Nagaland University offers a 4 years (FYUGP) course in Arts Stream. FYUGP course incorporates the principles of the newly introduced National Educational Policy (NEP) 2020 and stresses on bestowing an all-encompassing generic learning for the students.

The college offers only BA Honours Program under the School of Social Sciences and Humanities for the FYUGP courses.

**BA Major Courses: Economics, Education, English, History, Philosophy & Political Science.**

### Outlines of Four Years Under Graduate Program (FYUGP)

**Major discipline:** It is the discipline or subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the prescribed number of credits (about 50% of total credits) through core courses in the major discipline.

**Minor discipline:** It helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the major discipline. For example, if a student pursuing an Economics major obtains a minimum of 12 credits from a bunch of courses in Statistics, then the student will be awarded BA degree in Economics with a Minor in Statistics.

**Note:** 50% of the total credits from minor may be secured in the relevant subject/discipline and another 50% of the total credits can be earned from any discipline as per students' choice.

Students are advised to choose Minor discipline from other relevant subjects in such a way that the knowledge gained from the Minor papers enriches the study of Core Major course of the student.

**Awarding UG Certificate, UG Diploma and Degrees**

**UG Certificate:** Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 40 credits will be awarded a UG Certificate if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the first year. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree program within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

**UG Diploma:** Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and have secured 80 credits will be awarded a UG Diploma if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the second year. These students are allowed to re-enter within three years and complete the degree program within the maximum period of seven years.

**3-Year UG Degree:** Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG program will be awarded UG Degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 120 credits and satisfying the minimum credit requirements as given in table 1

**4-Year UG Degree (Honours):** A four-year UG Honours degree in the major discipline will be awarded to those who complete a four-year degree program with 160 credits and have satisfied the credit requirements as given in table 1

**4-Year UG Degree (Honours with Research):** Students who secure 75% marks and above in the first six semester and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. They should do research project or dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the college. The research project/dissertation will be in the major discipline. The students, who secure 160 credits, including 12 credits from research project/dissertation, are awarded UG Degree (Honours with Research)

**Note:** Honours students not undertaking research project will do 3 theory courses for 12 credits in lieu of a research project/Dissertation.

**UG Degree Program with Single Major:** A student has to secure a minimum of 50% credits from the major discipline for the 3-year/4-year UG degree to be awarded a single major. For example, in a 3-year UG program, if the total number of credits to be earned is 120, a student of Physics with a minimum of 60 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. in Physics with single major. Similarly, in 4-year UG program, if the total number of credits to be earned is 160, a student of Physics with a minimum of 80 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. (Hons./Hon. with Research) in Physics in a 4-year UG program with single major.

**UG Degree Program with Double Major:** A student has to secure a minimum of 40% credits from the second major discipline for the 3-year/4-year UG degree to be awarded a double major. For example, in a 3-year UG program, if the total number of credits to be earned is 120, a student of Physics with a minimum of 48 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. in Physics with double major. Similarly, in 4-year UG program, if the total number of credits to be earned is 160, a student of Physics with a minimum of 64 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. (Hons./Hon. with Research) in Physics in a 4-year UG program with double major.

#### **Eligibility for the UG Program**

After successful completion of Senior Secondary School Leaving Certificate or Higher Secondary School Leaving Certificate (Grade 12 ) or equivalent stage of education corresponding to Level-4

#### **Admission Policy**

1. Admission will be given to students irrespective of race, sex, religion or caste.
2. Fairness will be maintained in giving admission to students in accordance with the policies laid down by the Admission Committee.
3. Students from Open Schools will not be given admission as per NAAC rules.
4. Transparency will be maintained while giving admission.
5. 5% of seats will be reserved for differently abled students
6. 10% of seats is reserved for SC, OBC & others.
7. 5% of seats is reserved for students from other Board.
8. Credit admission will not be permissible.
9. To be eligible for admission to the FYUGP, a minimum of 45% in particular subject in HSSLC is required to opt for major or must have secured not less than 45% in the aggregate in HSSLC examination.
10. Admission will be on a merit basis.
11. Application forms will be scrutinized by the Admission Committee and final selection by the concerned departments after the written exam & viva if necessary.
12. Rank holders and merit students in the qualifying examination shall be given priority in admission.
13. Original documents should be produced at the time of admission which will be cross checked by the Admission Committee.
14. Proper Address, Contact No. and Email address of the Parents/ local guardian should be submitted at the time of admission.
15. Admission forms will be issued after the declaration of the HSSLC Examination Result.
16. Names of the selected students along with their marks will be displayed on the Notice Board.
17. The college authority reserves the right to grant or deny admission.
18. Admission Fees once paid are not refundable.

#### Rules & Regulations

4. Every student is required to attain at least 80% of the class attendance in each subject. Students who fail to achieve 80% attendance will not be permitted to sit for their External/End Semester Examination.
5. Students failing to attend the classes on the reopening day and the last day before Summer and Winter break without valid reason or prior permission from the College Authority shall be liable to be punished..
